

BOOK GROUP Wednesday, February 8th at 1:00 pm

This month's book is <u>The Girl With Seven Names</u> by Hyeonseo Lee.

Unlike many memoirs about escaping North Korea, this one is told by a woman who grew up on the border with China in comfortable means. As a teen, on a whim, she crossed the line one day and found herself alone in a country with a very different culture. After ten dangerous years alone as an alien there, she fled to South Korea.
