The Thompson Board of Directors has proposed that The Thompson be renovated to better serve older adults of our community. The renovation involves a 1,800 square foot expansion of the facility including:

- An expanded dining room egress to enhance traffic flow and our patrons' use of outdoor space in the warmer months
- A major expansion of the kitchen and dining room
- A reconfiguration of the second floor to include additional meeting space

For more than 45 years The Thompson has helped older adults in our rural community age well by providing timely support and services. Our programs and activities foster the nutritional, physical, intellectual, and social well-being of our adult community to enhance dignity, self-worth, and independence.

Our current facility lacks the space and functionality of a 21st century center to age well. We must renovate to better serve our community and remain a vibrant and trusted place where older adults can continue to thrive.

The kitchen and dining room areas are outdated for current and future demands. A 210% growth of Meals on Wheels and in-house dining has far outpaced our capacity. The first-floor expansion will increase our ability to respond to these needs and provide space for large events.

Renovation of the second floor will provide much-needed space for meetings and programs freeing up other space for exercise classes and larger gatherings.

This is an exciting time in our history as we grow to meet the needs of our community. Your generous gift will help us reach our goal of \$1.95 million and expand The Thompson to meet our current and future needs. Please join us in building our future together.

Census projections for our area indicate that people over 65 are still the fastest-growing age group with the 70-85+ population more than doubling in the next 10 years."








NEW FRONT ENTRY WAY



1ST FLOOR NEW LIBRARY & PROGRAM SPACE








NEW DINING SET-UP
